GENERAL RULES FOR DISCIPLINE

1. Every student must carry his/her diary and identity card to school each day.
2. All students should come to the school regularly and punctually.
3. No child will be allowed to leave the school premises once he/she has come to school. In case any student requires to leave the school premises during the school hours, the parents are requested to submit an application to the Principal.
4. In case of an emergency, parents will be informed and they will have to report to the Principal.
5. Students should come to the school in prescribed neat and well-ironed uniform.
6. They will bring the books to the school according to the time table of the day.
7. The students should do the home work given in each subject regularly. Guardians are requested to sign the diary daily, after checking it. No student should damage any school furniture,
8. Student should bring only Text Books or Library books. (No other reading material)
9. Lending or borrowing of money or other articles is prohibited.
10. Distribution of birthday gifts in any form except to sweets, chocolates, is not allowed.
11. The school provides all the necessary material/ equipments for sport activity during the games period. Students are not allowed to bring their own balls, bats, etc, to school.
12. They will actively participate in all games, sports, athletics, cultural and literary activities.
13. The school reserves the right to suspend a student if his/her conduct is found to be unsatisfactory.
14. No student shall indulge in any of the following practices:
 - (a) Spitting in the school.
 - (b) Disfiguring or damaging school's property.
 - (c) Rude behavior and use of abusive language.
 - (d) Violation of school's rule and regulation in any from.
15. **Students are not allowed to come by any self driven vehicle other than bicycle. If they are found violating this rule, strict action will be taken by the school in the form of penalty of Rs.500/-.**

ADMISSION & EVALUATION

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The school admits boys and girls between the age of 3+ to 16, irrespective of caste, creed or socio-economic status of their parents.

Admission upto class KG is based on child's performance in the interview whereas for class I to IX and XI admission would be done through entrance test. The name of the student, date of birth, father's name, mother's name will not be changed once filled in the form. Guardians of the candidates selected for admission are required to present a photocopy of the report card of the previous class and Transfer Certificate from the school last attended at the time of admission within 30 days which will be considered provisional, thereafter, the admission will be treated as 'Cancelled'. Those coming from other districts should have their T.C. countersigned by a competent Educational Authority of the place. Birth certificate in original from Nagar Mahapalika/Maternity Hospital would be required for the admission in pre-primary classes.

PUPIL EVALUATION AND PROGRESS REPORTS

In keeping with the recommendation of National Policy of Education and National Curriculum Framework-2005, the school has integrated 'Evaluation' with the over all teaching-learning process. The child's progress in scholastic & non-scholastic area is reported to parents/guardians periodically as follows:

PRE-PRIMARY

At pre-primary stage evaluation of students is done on a three point scale of grading. At pre-primary stage assessment is purely qualitative judgement of children's activities in various domains and an assessment of the health and physical development, based on observation through everyday interaction.

CLASSES I & II

There is no formal assessment in classes I & II. Lesson Feedback, Test will be taken. The marks of Lesson Feed Back Tests will be assessed for the promotion to the next class. The year will be divided into two terms, 1st Term & 2nd Term. Moreover, time-to-time listening and speaking skills, mental mathematics, projects etc. will also be evaluated.

CLASSES III TO VIII

Assessment, examination pattern for classes III to VIII. The school shall implement uniform system of Assessment, examination pattern for classes III to VIII. The assessment structure and examination for these classes will comprise of two terms i.e. Term-I and Term-II.

Term-I is the first half of the session which will be of 100 marks in which 20 marks will be of periodic assessment and 80 marks of Half Yearly Examination. Periodic assessment will comprise of 10 marks of periodic test, 5 marks for notebook submission and written work for the term at the end of it and remaining 5 marks for subject enrichment activity. Term-II is the second half of the session which will be of 100 marks in which 20 marks for periodic assessment and 80 marks of yearly examination. Periodic Assessment will be same as in Term-I.

Long leaves will not be allowed to the students during teaching days except on medical grounds, 75% attendance is compulsory to appear in the terminal examination as per the CBSE norms.

LATE ARRIVAL

If any child comes late, the child will be sent back home

The fee will be paid by cash/cheque or through school console.

Fee must be paid positively by the last day of the month of April, July, October and January.

LATE FINE

If you fail to deposit the fee of your ward by the last day of the month i.e. April, July, October and January then Rs.20/- will be charged as late fine per day up to the last day of the next month i.e. May, August, November and February.

If the cheque bounces due to any reason, the fee will be deposited in cash in the school office along with the **cheque bouncing charges @Rs.300/-with admissible late payment.**

All dues must be cleared before the commencement of the Term/Examination. Failing to this, the child will not be allowed to appear in the Term Examination.

No fine to be waived off under any circumstance by the Principal.

Fee once paid will not be refunded in any case.

REMARKABLE FEATURES

ART AND CRAFT

GIRLS:

Tunic 'V' neck for Nursery to Class IV, pleated skirt for class V to X (of approved shade by the school) with half sleeved shirt and socks (of approved shade by the school) school tie, belt and black shoes. White half sleeved shirt, white tunic 'V' neck for nursery to IV, white pleated skirt for class V to X, white half sleeved shirt, belt, white P.T. shoes (on Wednesday.) For class-XI and XII full sleeved kurta (of approved colour and pattern), white salwar, white dupatta(cotton) blue socks and black leather shoes (on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday), White full sleeved kurta and salwar and white dupatta (cotton), white socks and canvas shoes. (Wednesday and Saturday.)

BOYS:

Half sleeved shirts and half pants for Nursery to class V. Half sleeved shirts and full pants for class VI onwards of school approved shade. School tie, belt, black leather shoes and socks approved by the school. Half sleeved white shirt with white half pants, belt, white socks, P.T. shoes (on Wednesday) from class VI onwards for class XI & XII half sleeved shirt & full pant (of school approved shade), school tie, belt, socks and black leather shoes (on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday) white half sleeved shirt & full pant, belt, socks and white canvas shoes. (on Wednesday & Saturday).

WINTER

GIRLS:

Plain pullover with 'V' neck and blazer of school shade. Girls (upto class X) can wear full pants of school approved shade.

Note : Girls will use sky blue ribbon or hair bands on the week days and white ribbon on Wednesday and Saturday.

BOYS:

Full sleeved shirt and full pants for Nursery to XII of school approved shade. Plain pullover with 'V' neck and blazer of school approved shade.

HOUSE UNIFORM (SATURDAY)

GIRLS:

House coloured T-shirt with white tunic for class III- IV

House coloured T-shirt with skirt for class V-X. White Socks and P.T. Shoes.

BOYS:

House coloured T-shirt with white pants for class III to V.

House coloured T-shirt with white full pants for class VI to X.

White socks & white P.T. Shoes.

Note : Sikh students are supposed to wear sky blue turban on the week days and white turban on Wednesday and Saturday. To provide comfort and quality to the Students only cotton uniform is allowed in the school.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARENTS/ GUARDIANS

1. The guardians must intimate to the school about change of their address at the earliest in order to communicate them in urgent matters in respect of their children.
2. Guardians are not allowed to meet teachers during school hours without the permission of the Principal, alternatively, they can seek prior appointment from the teacher concerned through the school diary.
3. It is the parent's responsibility to ensure that their ward reaches school at least 5 minutes before the school commences.
4. Attending the morning school assembly is compulsory for all students as it inculcates a sense of companionship and discipline among the students.
5. Parents are not allowed, under any circumstances to enter the main school building without permission.
6. It is mandatory for all the parents to attend PTMs (Parent-Teacher Meeting) which are conducted in the school.
7. Guardians of girls are advised, not to allow their wards to wear any jewellery. Besides their nails should be properly trimmed and girls with long hair are supposed to come in two blades.
8. Strict action will be taken, if a student is found guilty of damaging school property.
9. To ensure safety of the bicycle, students are advised to lock their bicycle and keep them at their allotted place.
No child is allowed to come to school by scooty or motorbikes.
10. It is imperative for the students to actively participate in different co-curricular & extra-curricular activities organized by the school.
11. Parent's cooperation is required, to ensure overall development of their child.

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
